Y4,5 and 6: Mrs Cox

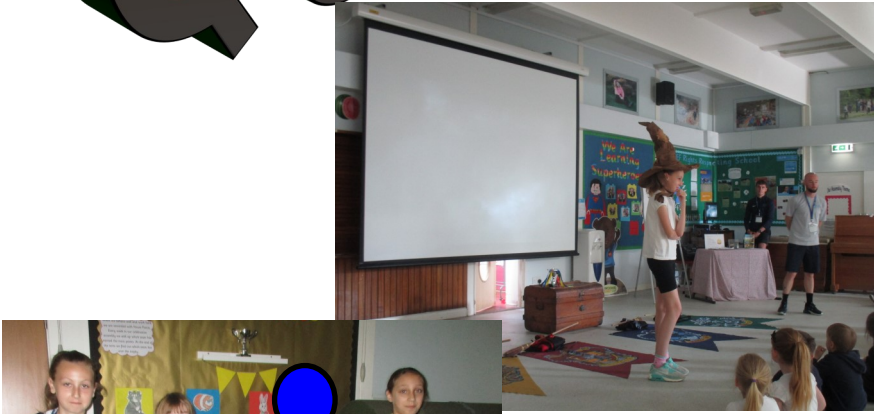

Quidditch Day!

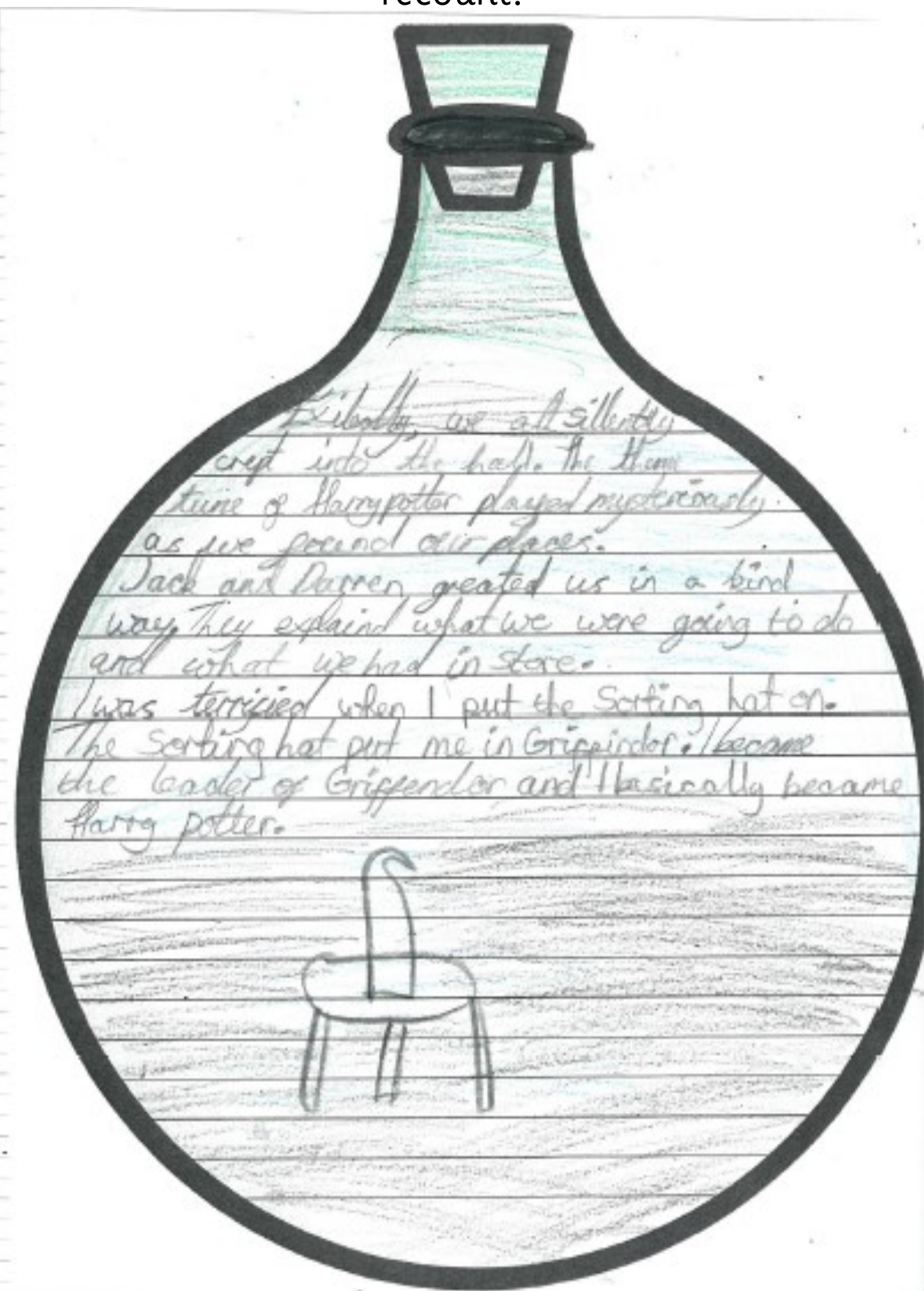

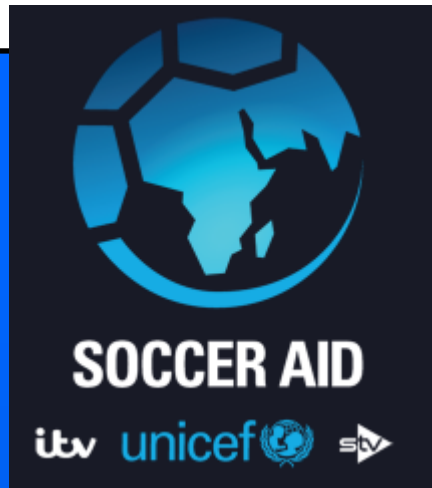

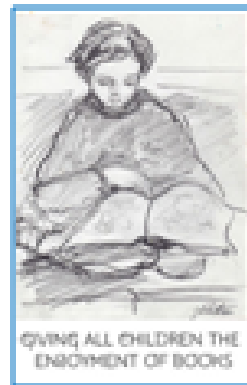
When? Tuesday 25th June
