We will be holding a Parents' Information meeting next Thursday 17th October, after school for half an hour or so when we can share with you the exciting new curriculum changes that are being introduced at the moment in school. We would love to see as many of you attend this session as possible to find out more about what your child is learning in school and how best to support them.

On Tuesday, Mrs Thorneywork and Ms Walker attended training with school nurse Ashley Witnall at Sydenham. Ashley trained them in how to respond to emergencies when children are suffering from asthma or anaphylaxis and these staff learned how to administer epipens and inhalers when children need them.

If children with serious medical conditions do not have the correct (life saving) medication with them in school, we are able to refuse admittance. We need to make sure that we can keep all children safe.

Ashley gave us the following information to pass to parents:

If your child has asthma:

School need to be aware of children who have asthma and use an inhaler. <u>Please inform the school office</u> if this is the case for your child.

Your child should keep a blue (reliever) inhaler in school. This should be prescribed to them and come with a spacer, which we also need in school. Your GP can prescribe these. We note that many of our children with inhalers do not have a spacer with them. If this is the case for your child, please contact your GP and <u>provide us with a named spacer alongside</u> their inhaler.

Children with asthma should have regular reviews at their surgery. Part of this process should be to draw up a care plan (written by the nurse). <u>Please provide us with a copy of this (up to date) care plan</u>. If your child does not have one, or if it is over 12 months old, please contact your GP surgery to request one.

If your child has an epipen:

<u>We need to know if your child has an epipen</u> and, if this is the case, we need their medication at school. If this is relevant for you and you have not already told us, please inform the school office ASAP.

If your child has an epipen in school we will work with you to draw up a care plan so that all staff know how to respond in an emergency.

#### **Data Collection**

Your child should have brought home a data collection sheet recently. Please ensure that the information we have is correct and return the form to us as soon as possible. This is done annually as part of our GDPR (data protection) requirements.

We have noticed that a lot of children are arriving late in school at the moment. Please remember that the school day begins at 8:55 and anybody arriving after this time is classed as late. I have taken the following information from the Warwickshire Country Council website:

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- Punctuality is a legal requirement for school student.
- Being on time for school is very important. Many schools concentrate on the key skills such as literacy and numeracy at the beginning of the school day. Children who arrive late can miss important learning.
- Late arriving children also miss important information about what is happening during the day. This can leave a child confused and distressed when he/ she does not know what is going on.
- Schools will monitor lateness carefully because it is often a precursor to later disaffection and absenteeism.
- If your child arrives late at school, he/she will have to be signed in and a parental explanation recorded. Persistent, severe or unexplained lateness can be classed as unauthorised absence and may be referred to the Local Authority.

With attendance in mind we will be publishing the attendance figures for each class in school per week alongside the top attendance in the school. The minimum acceptable attendance, as stipulated by Warwickshire Local Authority, is 95%. Low attendance results in poorer educational progress and

# Calling all Parents

Could you help your child's school claim all the funding it's entitled to?

- Pupil Premium is extra funding that schools receive for any pupil who is entitled to a free school meal. Schools can receive £1,320 of funding per year for 6 years per pupil, totalling £7,920.
- Many schools don't receive this funding because of the introduction of universal free school meals for all 4-7 year olds. Parents don't make a claim because their child receives a hot meal anyway.
- For a school to access this funding, parents must apply for free school meals, but this doesn't mean the meal has to be taken. However an application must be made!
- We can help you to make this application AND check you are receiving your full benefit entitlement.

Families do not claim all they are entitled to, and there is often more to be claimed – do you also want to see if you are getting your full benefit entitlement?

We are a free and confidential advice service

We can do a '*benefits and free school meals check*' to see if you are missing out and we will fill in any forms that are required.
