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

TEACHING ABOUT LAW. ADVANCING JUSTICE FOR ALL.

On Thursday we were visited by law students at Warwick University who are working on a project called The Street Law Project. They talked to the children in 4,5,6 about human rights and helped to consolidate their learning about what rights are, but also to understand why they are important. They talked about the concepts of equality, and we discussed where in history and in some cases today there has been discrimination. They understood the message that it is OK to be ourselves and that we should not be discriminated against because of it. The children were able to make links to their previous topic's learning and spoke confidently about their understanding of rights because we are a UNICEF Rights Respecting School.

Selection Box Raffle




