# Year 1/2/3 Zoolab Visit



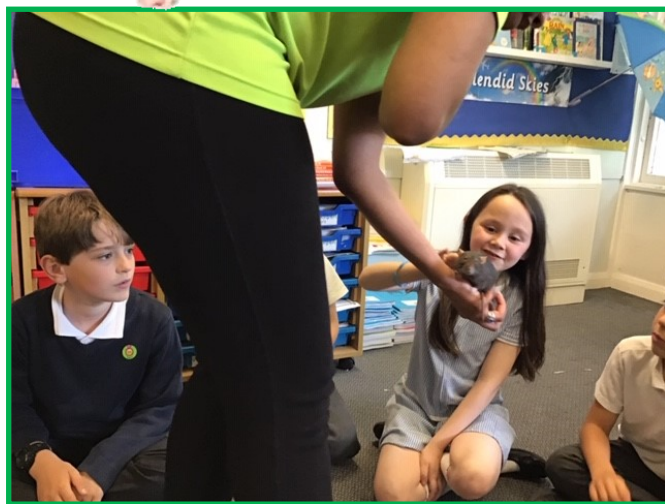

It was a fantastic learning experience and the children really enjoyed the opportunity to get up close and handle the animals.

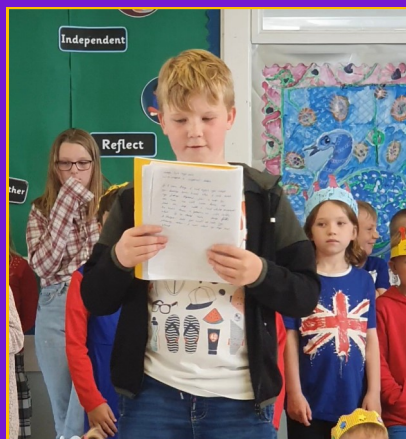

# HRH The Queen's Platinum Jubilee



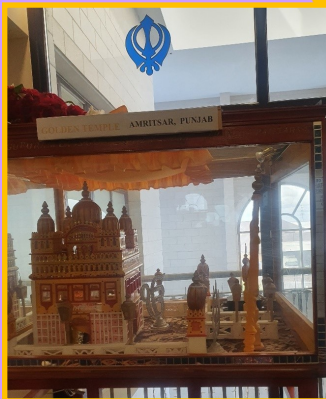

One of the Three Duties that a Sikh must carry out is to give. Visitors to the Gurdwara are given a delicious meal. Mrs Stafford's food looks yummy!

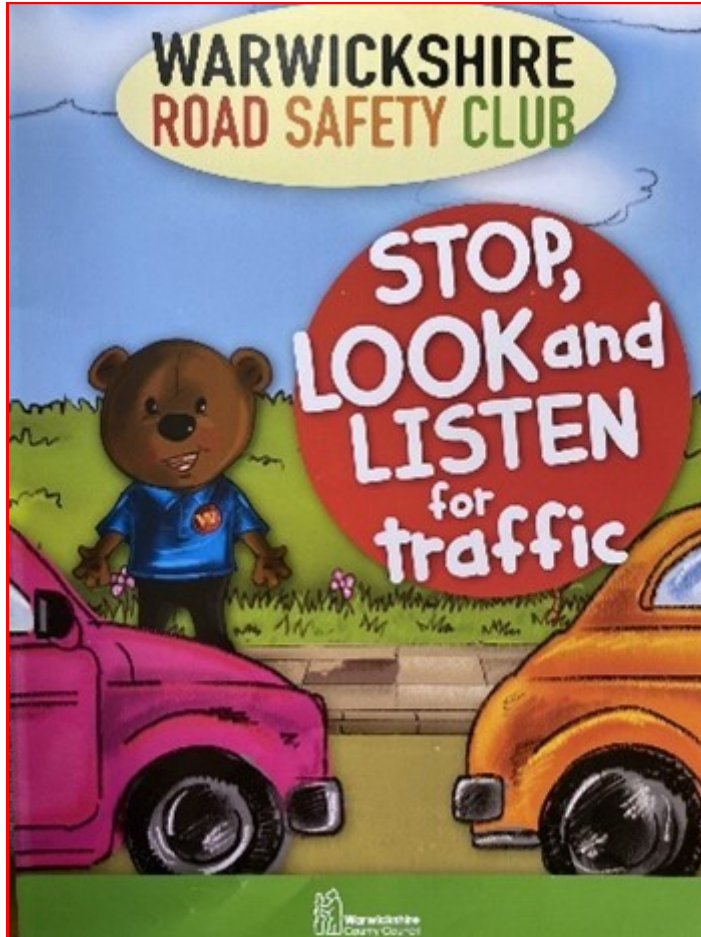




# Nursery/Reception

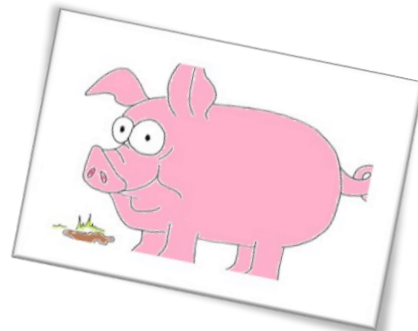
# Lighthorne Heath Learning Heroes

### Tips For Wellness:

#### Sharing

If you are struggling with something in your life, like a situation at school, or with how you are feeling, you may find it helpful to share what's going on inside your head with someone else. Our thoughts and feelings can feel huge and sometimes no matter how hard we try to sort things out for ourselves we need a bit of help to make sense of things.

When we share our experiences, it helps us to feel like we are not alone and it may also help someone else. Choosing to open up to your friends and family can feel scary and you might be worried about how they will react. That's okay, many people feel like this and here are some things you can do to make it easier:

1. If you're finding it difficult to explain how you're feeling you can try writing it down. It's okay if you don't share everything at once, having small conversations at first can help you feel more comfortable sharing your thoughts over time.
2. If you're struggling with talking to someone, then talk to a toy or a pet. It may feel strange at first, but sometimes voicing your thoughts can make them feel less scary.
