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School Meals - Year 2

If you have a child in Year 2, you will be aware that they are entitled to a school meal under the Universal Infant Free School Meal scheme. As the entitlement applies to children in Year R, Year 1 and Year 2 only, this entitlement will end for your child on 21 July 202. If you would like your child to continue to have a school meal in September, the cost per day is £2.30. Please see the letter sent home this week via email for further information.

You will continue to receive a free school meal if you have previously registered with the free school meals office. Please contact the school office if you are unsure if you are currently registered.

We have today been informed by our external catering company that the cost of a school meal will increase with effect from September 2022 to £2.30 per day.

Nursery & Reception On the Beach Take One Picture Project

As part of our 'Take One Picture' Art week, we had the exciting opportunity to have a private workshop with the National Gallery in London. Fiona, a Gallery Educator, showed us photos that helped us to understand where the gallery is located and what it looks like inside. She then took us on a virtual walk through the museum. As part of the tour, Fiona focused our attention on an individual painting and brought it to life through interactive storytelling.



Following our gallery tour, we've spent time slowly revealing and exploring Claude-Joseph Vernet's 'A Shipwreck in Stormy Seas'. This has linked beautifully to our current learning topic 'On the beach' and our recent exploration of Shakespeare's 'The Tempest' which has resulted in the children being able to articulate some lovely responses to the painting.



Year 1/2/3 Take One Picture Project

This week the children took part in a range of creative activities as part of our school Arts week. We looked at the painting 'A Shipwreck on Stormy Seas' by Claude-Joseph Vernet. To begin with the children looked closely at the painting and talked about what they liked and disliked about it. They then listened to some selected pieces of classical, instrumental music and decided which music would fit best with the painting and it's subject. Following this they explored a range of percussion instruments and grouped them into different parts of the storm e.g rain, clouds and the sea. They played music to accompany a small group who acted out a story to bring the painting to life, thinking carefully about the scene before and after the storm. The children created their own scenery using the technique of Batik (a wax resist technique,) to capture the movements of the sea during the storm. They finally tied all the elements together producing a short, musical performance of their interpretation of Vernet's 'A Shipwreck on Stormy Seas'.

We will be submitting information about the children's Take One Picture project learning to the National Gallery at the beginning of the Autumn Term, so that staff at the gallery can see how Vernet's painting has inspired the children and helped them to develop their textiles skills.

They had an online tour of the National Gallery with our own guide, Bethan, who led a great session and knowledgably answered the children's questions. She introduced the class to a painting by Claude Vernet called 'A Shipwreck in Stormy Seas.'

The children have been using this painting as their inspiration for a number of activities in class, including poetry and suspense writing.







They created colour wheels and learned about primary, secondary and tertiary colours. They learned about contrasting colours and will use these later in the week when they work on our art project - 3-dimensional fish.




