Reception class have been really excited to start a new project this term called 'Drawing Club'.

Drawing Club helps the children become fully immersed in the magic world of tales and stories whilst at the same time enriching their language and fine motor skills. It's an approach that encourages imagination in a world where anything can, and often does, happen. Have a look at a small selection of their incredible drawings.

This week the children have found it fascinating to watch an animation from the past called 'Trapdoor'. By exploring the story, we've focused on the character, setting and even been posing questions to wonder what might happen next.

We've also used the drawing process as an opportunity to embed secret codes that embrace alphabetic and numeric code. We've been so impressed with the quality of the children's pictures and their enthusiasm for coming up with their own creations.









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
The children in Years 1 and 2 have been working hard to consolidate their learning linked to our topic 'The Enchanted Woodland'.

Article 29: Goals of education



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The children in years 3 & 4 took part in a topic lesson earlier this week where they immersed themselves in the life story of physician James Lind. They engaged in thoughtful discussions and made a list of questions that they would like to ask him if they ever had the chance to meet him. Their questions included aspects about his profession, the origins of scurvy and its symptoms.

In a delightful twist, 'James Lind' unexpectedly visited their class, providing the children with an opportunity to actually pose their questions to him. During this encounter, they uncovered fascinating facts, discovering that James Lind was renowned for his ground-breaking work in preventing and curing scurvy. They learned that scurvy's symptoms include bleeding gums, tooth loss, and itchy rashes. Moreover, they learned that during experiments, sailors who received citrus fruit got much better.

Subsequently, they wrote a non-chronological report about James Lind and his ground-breaking discovery. They wrote sections on his life, the disease scurvy, his experiment, and the significance of vitamin C. This report featured well-organised subheadings and illustrations, showcasing their dedication to presenting their work neatly.

Dear Parent/Carer

The government's Household Support Fund has provided local authorities with one-off funding for families, and vulnerable residents, who may need financial help with significantly increased living costs.

As a parent or carer with one or more children who are eligible for benefits related free school meals, Warwickshire County Council will be providing vouchers to support you during these challenging times.

You will receive this cost of living payment on 20th October 2023. This will be a £30 voucher for each child at home who is in receipt of benefits related free school meals in addition to one £75 voucher for each eligible Warwickshire household to help with your household costs.

The supermarket vouchers will be processed automatically, and you **do not** need to contact us to apply. You will be sent an SMS text message from our voucher scheme **Huggg**, with a message from Warwickshire County Council that will have a link to the supermarket vouchers attached.

You will need to activate your voucher by:

- clicking on this link and then 'Tell me more' followed by 'I'm ready to claim',
- selecting which supermarket you would like to shop at (the choices are Aldi, Asda, Farmfoods, Iceland, M&S, Morrison's, Sainsbury's, Tesco, and Waitrose),
- selecting 'Claim now' and,
- once you have chosen your voucher, hitting 'Click for your voucher'.

The final screen will reveal the voucher from your chosen supermarket, and you will need this to pay for your shopping. Vouchers can all be used instore and those from Asda, M&S, Sainsbury's and Waitrose can also be used online. The voucher value does not have to be spent all at the same time, so please ensure you keep your vouchers safe.

If we do not have a valid mobile number for you, we will send the voucher link to you by email from <u>hello@huggg.me</u> If you do not have a smartphone, we will post the voucher.

If you have a problem with activating your voucher, please use the 'Frequently Asked Questions' online at <a href="https://www.warwickshire.gov.uk/localwelfarescheme">https://www.warwickshire.gov.uk/localwelfarescheme</a> or use the Chat facility on the Huggg website <a href="https://www.huggg.me/">https://www.huggg.me/</a>



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Please check the expiry date on your voucher as it cannot be redeemed or reissued after the expiry date, so ensure you activate your voucher within this time. Do also check your spam or junk folders just in case the emails have gone in there.

The Local Welfare Scheme can help with the following issues. Please call 0800 4081448 or 01926 359182, between **10am and 2pm**, when staff will be available to assist you.

- You do not receive the SMS text or email voucher link for your child or children by Monday 23<sup>rd</sup> October 2023. You can call us between 23<sup>rd</sup> October and 3<sup>rd</sup> November 2023 and will still receive the full voucher value. We receive an exceptionally high volume of calls so you may wish to consider calling after the 26th October 2023 when the phone lines may be less busy.
- If a supermarket from the options listed is not easily accessible and an online delivery is not possible.
- If you have other children who are not yet attending school and would like to claim an additional Huggg supermarket voucher for these children, please call us between 23<sup>rd</sup> October and 3<sup>rd</sup> November 2023 only to apply. Again, we receive an exceptionally high volume of calls so you may wish to consider calling after the 26th October 2023 when the phone lines may be less busy. Remember that calling us later will not change the amount of the award you will receive.

Please note: The Local Welfare Scheme will be using the Household Support Fund to support other Warwickshire residents with utility costs during November 2023. As part of this cost of living payment in October, you have received a £75 voucher for your household, therefore you are not eligible to apply again in November.

#### Mental Health in Schools Team (MHST) Parent/Carer Tips for Wellness:

#### STARTING CONVERSATIONS AROUND MENTAL HEALTH

It can be difficult to speak with your young person about their mental health and wellbeing. It is important to try different methods and see what works for you.

#### Useful conversation starters:

"How are you feeling?"

"What was the best and worst bit of your day?"

RISE

"How can I help you?"

"I can see that you are feeling \_\_\_\_\_. Do you want to talk about it?"

"Today I felt \_\_\_\_\_. How did you feel today?"



More conversation starters!

Some young people find it easier to have these conversations when they do not need to make eye contact. Try having these conversations whilst doing a normal activity, such as cooking dinner, washing up or even in the car!

#### Top Tip: Try to avoid starting these conversations around bedtime.

#### Discussing and expressing feelings:

- Try using emojis, coloured stickers or pictures to show how you are feeling.
- If your young person finds it hard to have these conversations, they could try sending you text messages to let you know how they feel or using a shared feelings diary.

Statements of encouragement can help a young person share their feelings:

"I love you, nothing can ever change that"

"Even if I don't understand, know that I want to"

"If you need to talk to someone else, that's ok too"

"It is ok to feel this way"

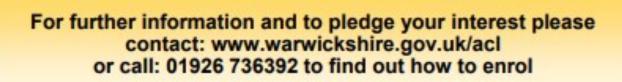


