WHAT THE PROJECT AIMS TO DO

- 1 Encourage young children to develop an early love of books and reading through choosing and having their own books at home.
- 2 Allow children to select one or two books a week for themselves from the age appropriate categories, to take home when it suits them.
- 3 Avoid any need to buy or obligation to return the books.
- 4 Remove any stress and financial constraints on parents over acquisition of books.
- 5 Encourage parents to read with their children at home










