WHAT CAN YOU DO?

PROFESSIONALS: ask every patient/service user about their home life; in the current pendemic, asking every patient/service user will help you identify vulnerable individuals who need support.

COMMUNITIES: Saloguarding is everyones responsibility, and with the closure of schools, communities now have an even greater role to play in protecting children from abuse. If you are concerned about a child or vulnerable adult, contact your local social care team or the police. In an emergency, always contact 999. The police are still working to keep communities safe.
