Kasper's Top Trumps Bug Game and his beautiful colouring from the story 'The Ant and the Dove.'



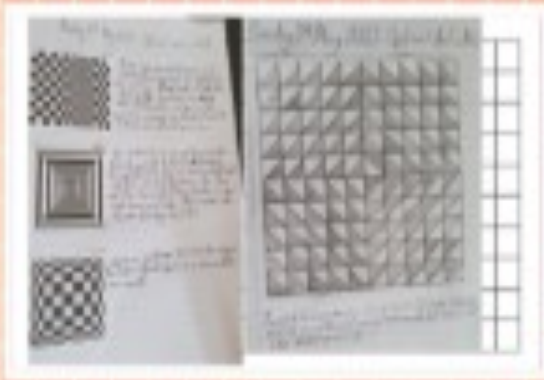
Spencer's Top Trumps game complete with instructions about how to play.
